REPORTS OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS OF THE CITY

MAYOR JAMES J. MELFI PRESENT

Mayor Melfi thanked the Chairman. The Mayor said that first of all he wanted to thank the Trumbull County Health District for their assistance on a number of items. One is already completed. An individual on Mosier Road, at the very top near Liberty Street, decided to throw their construction debris down the side of the hill, you might noticed before the leaves grew in, and into the area we know as Liberty Park. Melfi continued, with the help of Trumbull County that mess, which was on a pretty steep cliff, is cleaned up and back to its original state. The Mayor said sometimes he just shakes his head on this job and wonders why. Furthermore in the area of Trumbull County Health, at their upcoming meeting on May 26th, 1047 Washington Avenue will be condemned if it is not brought up to their recommendations by May 26th. The Mayor said we will go forward, we have already tested for asbestos at that site, and the testing came back good for us. There is a bit of asbestos on the wrap around the heating duct but very minor in cost. That will be coming down. The Mayor continued, 25 W. Liberty Street, the Law Director has informed him that he would like to file a warrant for our environmental specialist to enter and take samples there as well. As everybody remembers, Trumbull County has condemned 25 W. Liberty as well. Melfi stated they are moving along. Unfortunately a little too slow, but we are following the rules. Sometimes it is just easier to bring the bulldozer in, but what are we going to do.

COMMENTS:

President of Council Paolone asked what is next at Liberty Street. The Mayor stated that the Law Director is recommending that once Trumbull County has sent them the paperwork, and they are going to do so tomorrow, the official paperwork, he is going to give the owner an additional thirty days to bring it up to code. If he doesn't at that point and time we are free to warm up the bulldozer.

Councilman Schubert asked who that cost goes back to. The Mayor answered that initially that cost will be the City's and that is why he is bringing everybody along on this because it is not going to be a typical demolition. The homes, he has already received a bid of \$6,000 on those homes. That location will not be \$6,000 but they will, as Councilman Moliterno stated, obviously lien his taxes and go from there. The Mayor said that it is the beginning of some urban renewal.

Councilman Grumley asked if they are obligated to give them another thirty days. The Mayor responded that that is a question for the Law Director. He wants to say he likes to always follow his Law Director's recommendations. Councilman Standohar stated the advisor to the unadvisable.

Councilman Martuccio asked if there is any way they can move that mural before the thirty days. Move it in the next couple of weeks. The Mayor responded not to worry about the mural. He said it is not ours yet. Martuccio said it is ours actually. She said they can move it anytime they want. The Mayor said if she would like, they'll get it. He promises her. Councilman Martuccio thanked the Mayor and he said he likes that mural himself.

SAFETY/SERVICE DIRECTOR JERRY LAMBERT PRESENT

Service Director Lambert said that tomorrow afternoon the Engineer and he will be going out to see the two projects they have going on right now. The one's on Wellman and Joan and also the one around the school just to see how things are progressing. Lambert said there are a couple of calls he has already gotten on some things that need to be addressed and they will address those tomorrow. He will give Council an official report at the next meeting. Service Director said they also, and he knows he has gotten some phone calls, they have their, this time of year is the hardest in regards to the high grass. What they actually have to do, according to the Law Director, the very first time they have to give these people a five day notice and after the five day notice is given the first time they do not have to give them a notice after that. Once the grass gets to a certain height they can just automatically go in and cut it down. They did have a complaint in regards to Dollar General. He sees that they cut it over the weekend. The administration is going to get a hold of their main office just to see what has been going on with that because they should not have to do that for a business in town. Lambert said that the first list that he got they had like ten different addresses that they took care of or are in the process because of the rain. They have that started already. Among Monica, Nancy and himself got a list together. They are making sure that they get cut and then every day from this point hereon they should be getting a list from the zoning department and those will be handed out to people to get the grass cut as fast as possible. Lambert said this time of year with the rain and the grass growing as fast as it does, he hopes that they will bare with the administration and the people that are really complaining the most they are sending the zoning department right out there to make sure they are on the list be cut the next time.

COMMENTS:

Councilman Standohar said that he is very glad to hear that they are contacting Family Dollar um Dollar General. He continued that he doesn't think he ever recalls seeing a business of that nature have such poor maintenance of their property. It is unprecedented in his book, in his estimation. If you look at the Rite Aid building how beautifully manicured the lawn is all the time, the beautiful shrubbery. That company really put it over on us. Standohar said that they said that they were going to so much nice landscaping and take care of the grounds. It is a disaster. It really is. Standohar continued it is not even treated in any way. Dandelions everywhere. Uncut grass. The little effort that they did, the pine trees dead. Councilman Standohar said he has never seen a worst kept commercial property like that. It is very discouraging. The Mayor responded that today they tried to track down, if you recall, there was an attorney from Cleveland that was representing them during the preconstruction phase, and he thinks he tracked him down. He is at a new firm and still represent Dollar General so hopefully they have some conversation tomorrow or in the upcoming few days. It isn't for lack of business. If anybody knows Dollar General's business it is very successful nationwide and they have a formula going on and successfully they have put out other small business and grocery stores and that type of thing because they do quite a business. It is not for lack of income that they cannot maintain that building or those grounds. Councilman Standohar said that you would think that that was a vacant business location the way it looks. It is really, really poor.

LAW DIRECTOR BRIAN KREN ABSENT

Auditor Coleman said that she did not have a report this evening but she wanted to briefly explain an ordinance that she will be asking for tonight. It is to establish a new fund for the federal money that they are receiving for the American Rescue Plan. This fund will be used only to track and separately account for the federal funding coming to the City through the ARP Act.

FINANCE-MOLITERNO-GRUMLEY-ZIRAFI

Councilman Moliterno said he had no report other than he would like to set a finance committee meeting for 6:30 pm prior to their next council meeting.

COMMENTS:

President of Council Paolone stated that that would be May 24, 2021.

Mayor Melfi stated that the Treasurer was kind enough, at their request, to send the Administration his report. They have not received one for several months. Melfi continued, he doesn't know if they were in the penalty box or what have you, but he, as you know, some time ago, and as he stated earlier this evening, that it is very important for them to have accurate income tax numbers and very important for the upcoming monies and possible transfers to the general fund. After the Treasurer's four month sabbatical he finally showed up here and, obviously there is a pattern, he comes during the finance meetings and that is it. The Mayor further stated that he has to remind this body that this City was down over a half a million dollars in income tax last year and despite a stellar budget, a very healthy financial report, that is our only blemish. That is a concern. It is concern going forward because these dollars will end some day. The Mayor said he is looking at this report and, there again he doesn't want to say he was treasurer eleven years, he doesn't want to put any colleagues here on the spot, but there is no one here, including myself, that added any of these numbers up and could even understand them. The Mayor said that he would recommend to the Treasurer that he looks back to the 1990s or 2000s and get somebody's report who was the treasurer before him so they could understand this. There again, no one added this up because he doesn't even understand it. Melfi continued he understands a daily log. This is the money that comes in daily. They need a monthly report with a breakdown of the various tax dollars and a quarterly report, which he believes, the Law Director isn't here, but he believes by law that they have to have a quarterly report. Just taking something from RITA and sending it to somebody in an email, and he had his printed out and has been looking at it for days and his mind is scrambleda so he guesses if he shows at the next meeting he will ask him about more specifics when it comes to the finances. The Mayor thanked the Chairman.
