**CITIZENS' COMMENTS**

Linda Petracca, 368 E. Kline St. Mrs. Petracca stated that they were here at the last meeting because they had to complain about their neighbor and his junk yard next to them and him cutting metal every single day and they wanted to come back today to see the follow-up and what is going on, if they could give them any insight on what they are doing. Mrs. Petracca said she knows that the day after the meeting they had the zoning person, Danny Rau, did go to the neighbor. He was there for approximately a minute and a half two minutes. She doesn't know what he did. She doesn't know if he gave him another citation or did he just talk to him and said what he had to do. Talked to him and said you're okay you don't have to do anything. Petracca asked if when zoning goes to a person's house do they have to make any kind of report out or make any documentation to see what was done or transpired? She said that she is just trying to find out is anybody doing anything about this. It has been over a year and she is pretty disgusted. She just wants to know if anything is going on because she could tell you what is not going on. He is not doing anything to clean up. He is still shooting metal. He is cutting metal every single day. It is still against the law in the State of Ohio and it is against the law for an ordinance of Girard. She asked if anyone could give her any insight on who she is supposed to talk to?

Mayor Melfi said that he doesn't know what Danny Rau found or did not find. He did not speak to him about that visit. They do know about the sawing and it has been going on for even longer than a year. As they know, he is on probation so if he, specifically if he is cutting metal, he is in violation of his probation. They have to know. The court has to know, even beyond them, the court has to know. Obviously, he is not in the backyard there. If they know he is cutting the metal, if they hear he is cutting the metal, if they don't want to call the court and want to call them, they will walk up to the court and tell them that he is

violating his probation. The mayor said he is on probation for doing exactly what you just said he is continuing to do. He has been convicted of it by the court so he is on probation. They just need to know. Ms. Petracca interrupted and asked need to know what, when he is cutting it? The mayor said that is correct. If you call him or Jerry he will go up to the court and tell them he is in violation of his probation. The mayor said you know what is going to happen. The probation officer is going to go up there. He may stop him. Who knows. But at least they documented it with the court. They need to know. Petracca asked if he wanted her to take a video of it. Mayor Melfi said any way they want to let them know, but he needs to know as soon as they hear it. They will do what they can with the court. It is in the court's hands. She said she knows that. That's the point. It is getting lost. She said she will definitely call him. The mayor said if you take a video that's even better. She said she can probably do that if he doesn't call the police on her. The mayor said he might be taking a video of her backyard too. They certainly know how these things go. She said she would do that and thanked them.

Dominic Petracca, 368 E. Kline Street. Mr. Petracca said he just had a little follow up on what is going on up there. It is an ongoing problem. This gentleman is not only running a junkyard there, everything that he has on his property, behind the garage, he is allowing animals to jump their fence and get into their yard. Their yard is fenced in. Petracca said he does have his dog that stays in that fence and he takes him when he needs to take him somewhere and he is tired of having animals come in and threaten his dog. He is not doing it. They are critters. He is tired of it. It has to be addressed. This gentleman came to town two years ago. He pulled in with a load of junk and it stayed there for two years. He finally got rid of the boat but that's all he got rid of. The rest of it is still there. He has logs, trash cans that are rotting in the backyard, everything that brings in wild animals. He would appreciate them putting an end to it.

Mayor Melfi said they have noticed this for a long time. The individuals who obviously they don't respect city zoning laws or ordinances. They know that, but they see disrespect for the actions of the court. The mayor said sometimes, and he is not saying that this is about our court, sometimes courts don't take zoning violations as seriously as maybe they should. Maybe if that junkyard was next to the judge maybe he would. The mayor said he is not picking on their judge. You have to understand everything is prioritized and he maybe that is not his priority, but maybe it should be if they lived next door to him. Mayor Melfi said they've seen this deteriorating over a long period of time. The disrespect. Just be a little neat, and a little respectful of your neighbors. They see it all the time.

Mr. Petracca said someone brought up maybe their yard is different. He can tell them his yard is different. They have kept up their yard long as they've lived there. Everything in their yard is done correctly and he is appalled that this guy has no respect for anything they have done for their property.

Phil Pegg, Vienna Township Trustee, 1316 Youngstown Kingsville Rd., Vienna. Mr. Pegg said he is there tonight with another trustee, Attorney Robert Root, do you need his address? President of Council said only if he speaks. Mr. Pegg continued, it is really quite simple, but there are two items tonight. The first item is the City of Girard has federal rights in the area between Stillwagon and Niles-Vienna for sewage in that area. The City of Niles has decided they would like to annex that area and provide sewers according to the papers. Pegg said they need to look at their rights because it is granted by the federal government. He stated what they would like to ask respectfully ask the council is for a letter that they can give to the county commissioners stating that the federal law states that that is your area and that you are not willing to give up your rights to allow Niles to put sewers there. That is the first item. Mr. Pegg said the second item, the servicing of Upper Girard Lake, or like they like to call it, Upper Vienna Lake. The whole lake, the lake is split between Vienna and Liberty. The problem that they have though is that the roadways, Niles Vienna borders the lake. Since the lake has been purchased and annexed by the City of Girard they have had numerous things requiring their services in the lake. It goes back to the beginning where their police department received a call from 911, there's boats on the lake. It is not their lake. Your lake. You need to send your police department up there and police it. They have had, that he can think of, three different vehicles in the lake, one which, he believes it was three years ago, you can check with 911, a woman in a minivan ended up in the lake. A snow plow driver from the engineer's office witnessed it, called them, they were there in three minutes. Pegg said they got the woman out of the van, got her children out of the van, got them into the back of their squad and warmed them up. Approximately 20 minutes from the time they arrived, and again 911 will give them all of these times, Girard Fire Department shows up. You guys have a lake and you are not servicing it. The latest was the boat and yea they're all smiling about the boat floating around, they received a phone call from 911 another car is overturned in the lake. They were there in 3 ½ minutes. Turns out it's a boat that has been floating around in the lake for three years. Somebody thought it was a vehicle. This time it is going to cost us some money due to the fact that they sent their fire truck, they sent their ambulance and they also sent one officer whose

vehicle was totaled when somebody not paying attention drove into their squad. From what they are getting from the insurance they are going to have, and a replacement vehicle, they found a used vehicle, they are going to have to come up with \$2,000 to replace that plus their deductible to the insurance company, so closer to \$3,000 for the whole incident. Pegg said since then he has spoken with the mayor and the fire department has removed the boat from the lake. They were aware that that boat has been floating around for three years. Pegg said your lake, please service it. They are very close to the point of coming up with a schedule they are going to send vehicles, they are going to send a bill. Does he want to do that? Absolutely not. They are friendly. They are neighbors. They don't want to do that but they cannot continue to send their staff there and while their staff is there they have another 25 sq. miles that they don't have coverage on. For a floating boat and to take up the time of their fire department and basically all of the fire department they will not, he doesn't know how many of them talk to firefighters or police officers, they are not going to let somebody die. They are going to show up, but at the same time something has to be looked at for servicing of the lake on their end. That is what they are respectfully requesting.

Mayor Melfi said he and Phil talked last Thursday and that was the first time he knew about the boat so he did not know about the boat until Phil called him. The fire department towed it out on Friday and it is cleared out. He said he likes to react to those type of things quickly which he did. He did not know about the boat. His guess is the motorist who made the call hits 911 and the location of the call pings off the tower and that's how it gets them. So it's not Girard shirking it's responsibility, there is a territorial situation going on that probably needs to be looked at because, there again, any calls like that is going to be whoever makes that call it is going to be located in that area and it is not going to be Girard. They know that that area is removed from the city. It is only connected to the city by a creek down below the lower dam, so they understand the situation. They don't want them doing their job. They don't want anybody doing what is their responsibility. Although they don't have a lot to do but they have plenty of mutual aid with a lot of communities. Melfi said he has no problem looking at how they can change that in the future as far as the 911 center is concerned. Until they do that, until they have a study done, if someone calls from their territory it goes there and it is pinging them out instead of us. The mayor asked the chief to speak.

Chief Petruzzi said that Mayor Melfi is correct. As far as gps goes the satellites on these towers, if somebody calls from a cell phone on Niles Vienna Road and it goes to Trumbull County 911, which we are not the same dispatch center, it is going to ping because Niles Vienna is Vienna Township and they are going to dispatch their fire department to that incident. They also take people's lives very seriously and they don't decline calls. As far as the cars on the lake, things of that such, the majority of the time they find out about those after they are on the news so he wished Chief Brannon had given him a call as a courtesy, but unfortunately that is going to fall on Vienna Township emergency services for not notifying them of said emergencies. These cars in the lake, like he said they don't know about them until they are on the news. There are personnel on the news stating that they have had extricating things of this such because there were vehicles in the lake and again they didn't know about it. Same thing with a propane truck that turned over in December. He doesn't know the exact location of where that occurred, if it was on lake property. Again, saw it on the news, didn't even know it happened until after the fact. It would just be a matter of Vienna Emergency services having 911 center notify their dispatch so that they can respond but they do not decline to respond to any calls that they are notified of.

Mr. Pegg said it has been looked at in the past. Where does Girard's responsibility begin and where does Vienna's? Believe it or not it is right down the center of the road. Anything towards the lake which would be the north side or west side of the lake is Girard's. The other side, the west side of the roadway, it's Vienna's. Yea that propane thing was just another incident in that a large propane tank on a truck overturned. Where it overturned is on the corner of Scoville Road and Niles Vienna. That is bad enough. The problem is at that corner is also an East Ohio Gas pumping station. Had that gone off it would have taken out quite a few people. Pegg said they could have used assistance that day. They did have two cars on the road. The problem is there were three roads leading to that spot so they could not block all of the roads and of course people were not paying attention and went around barriers, things of that nature. If you are unfamiliar with that area, drive by. It's just before the bridge there is a good size pumping station there that most people don't realize is there. There are times you can stand up and smell the gas so it happened in a really bad area. They handled it. They ended up getting Trumbull County's emergency management in and they found out some other things with the county engineer at that time which they are addressing now.

Councilman Grumley said as chair of the health and safety committee they will work with the chiefs and the administration and come up with a solution here in the next couple of months.

Mayor Melfi said let's go back to the federal guidelines for the wastewater. It is important to note, this is not something that they talk about on any basis with council, they are long established guidelines that are put forth by the federal government to determine the best way that communities can sewer their cities or townships. Those are established decades and decades ago. Communities don't give those rights up because they give you a footprint on how if there is a development in the future how they go about it. What is the most ecologically sensitive. Generally, the best economically and it is not something that the City of Girard was ever willing to give up. The mayor said he was approached a couple of different times and it was an absolute no because he would not do that. Number one it is what is best for all of the communities, those guidelines. Second of all, it has some benefit to the city. It has some economic benefit to the city and they are not giving anything up that is a benefit to the community. Melfi said it is a very rare event that that even comes up. It is more in a township situation with annexation.

Mr. Pegg said there are federal regulations they can provide if he wishes. The City of Girard is protected unless you give up the rights. Mayor Melfi stated that that won't happen with him.

Councilman Moliterno said on that same issue, he asked the mayor on the administrative side to put a letter together to the commissioners. There was some discussion regarding the letter.

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Mr. Lambert said he had a couple of things. He asked for the ordinance for the part time workers to be added tonight because he completely forgot about it. They need to get three positions in recreation to help Cookie and Mike Cardiero. He apologized for the lateness, but it just came up. Lambert said before them they have the bids for Keefer Road project and the bid on the street paving. They were obtained on June 8<sup>th</sup> last week. The bids for the streets they have a copy of them right there and they have a breakdown of all of them. The engineer's opinion was \$330,000 and the low bid was \$317,253 and it came from Lindy Paving. It is going to be up to them of course to bring in the legislation if they want to accept the bids and go from there. The other one, the Keefer Road project, that is the one that is going through Eastgate. That one they had a few bidders on that one as well and it came in below the engineer's estimate as well. The engineer's estimate was, the lowest bid came in at \$193,000. The engineer's estimate was \$206,000. Again that is through Eastgate. Lambert said he didn't have that breakdown. He doesn't have the actual breakdown on it yet but that was the low bid if they could ask for legislation to enter into the contract with them and then he will give them the breakdown. He forgets what the breakdown is between them and us. He thinks it's about \$65,000 off of that and that would be coming out of the water fund as well. That will connect that one area on Keefer Road that is completely blank and will help them give water to the Liberty area and basically loop the whole system. Mr. Lambert said he would like to call for a utility meeting to schedule a meeting to discuss garbage at their convenience. Right now, he knows every meeting or every other meeting they talk about the status of the pumps. They are kind of in limbo right now with that hoping because it's going to be. He did hear that it is possible that the Trumbull County Commissioners received notification from Trumbull County that there may be an agreement between them and Niles with regard to the water. He hasn't heard it. It hasn't seen it. Niles contacted him today and he said he would like to see the deal that Trumbull County made with them before they talk to them just to see where they came from. They were receptive to that today so he is guessing as soon as the commissioners let us know what the increase was from them, they can set up a meeting with Niles just to see where they are.

Councilman Kay said he had a quick question going back a little ways. When they had the problem with water on Liberty Street he had found some problem right there in front of Cochran's house on one of the issues he said he found something and they were addressing the problem. Kay said he was just wondering if it was still on the books to get repaired.

Mr. Lambert said yes there were a few things pending. One of those was that there is one area there that is constricted. It is not going to affect anything right now because supposedly all of the flooding problems have been addressed after they ran line down and fixed the water up at Churchill. Kay said he was just wondering if it was still there to get fixed, Lambert said it is still there.
