We do have COVID funds that the city has received and all communities have received. All cities have received these COVID funds. Consequently this would not take a dollar from our taxpayers. Sarah has organized the fact that we would have these treat bags manufactured by a local company, touch-free, no human contact. Also, the science museum in downtown Youngstown, WOW, has provided -- at a very low cost -- an experiment kit for all the children as well. The cost is based upon how

many children, which between preschool and 6th grade we have about 850 students in the City of Girard.

In speaking with the Attorney General's Office, they recommended that we have a resolution in place so we can proceed with this. Now, Sarah has spoken with the Mahoning County Prosecutor's Office and there is some boilerplate language. I would merely like tonight council approval to go forward. Obviously Halloween is going to be cancelled in the traditional sense based upon the pandemic. So I would like to have council approval to go forward and to have it in this very non-traditional manner, and of course to spend the funds from the COVID-19 dollars that the city has received. MR. PAOLONE: Mr. Grumley spoke with Mr. Kren today and we're good to go. Tom, do you want to --MR. GRUMLEY: I would like to make a motion in support of

MAYOR MELFI: What happened was this: The funds are coming from the Office of Budget and Management of the State of Ohio. So when I called there -- if you read the language about what you can use funds for it clearly states that anything that you are changing because of COVID-19, obviously, would qualify.

Well, I spoke with an individual there and he -maybe it was too soon. I called him maybe five or six weeks ago and I caught him off guard. He didn't think it qualified. Well, for those of you that know the Altiere family from Girard, they have a relative -- a good friend of Jerry's growing up -- who is an assistant attorney general in Columbus. We called him. And he said that he believes, whole-heartedly, they would be able to be used. But just to be sure and to button it up that each community should have a resolution passed by either their board of trustees or their council. And so that's why I'm here mentioning it to you this evening.

Obviously we are not going to spend \$50,000.00. It's not required that I have a resolution or an ordinance, but I would like everybody to be aware that things are going to change for the upcoming Halloween and these are the reasons why.

MR. PAOLONE: Any other comments? Questions? MR. MOLITERNO: I would like to give the Mayor credit. Through the Mayors Association, the Mayor approached

1 their office to try to get the other mayors in the valley together because they all have a similar problem when it comes to Halloween. And I think the end result of that is going to be a very, very positive one for all the children, not only in Girard but throughout the entire valley. They are going to potentially get much more than 4 they would've simply going door to door. It's going to be done very safely, and it's going to be done by the 5 officers of the city.
